BROADCAST LIAISON OFFICERS - RIGHTS HOLDERS' VITAL VENUE LINK

Providing the essential link between DAGBS and Rights Holders at the venues are the Broadcast Liaison Officers (BLOs), a team of people with a rich background of cultural, linguistic and sporting experience coming from twelve different countries and speaking a combined total of twenty languages. A few of the faces may even be familiar with Rights Holders as a number of the BLOs have experience working in Asia and with Asian broadcasters.

The team, assembled by Lise Cosimi-Bréant, Head of Information and Liaison, and Nathalie Schmitt, Information Coordinator, are looking forward to assisting Rights Holders with their unilateral bookings at the venues. "There will always be a BLO at each venue during competitions," says Nathalie, adding, "their job is to help facilitate the unilateral operations for all Rights Holders."

Having worked tirelessly as an information link between DAGOC and DAGBS and as part of the core team in Doha for over two years, Nathalie has an intimate understanding of what will be required from each BLO and the unique nature of each competition and venue.

Prior to the start of competition at each venue the BLOs can be found at the Broadcast Information Office (BIO), generally located in the broadcast compound (for more information on Venue BIO locations, please come to the IBC BIO). During competition the BLOs are stationed inside the venue, working across the various broadcast areas. If unable to locate a BLO at the venue, the IBC Broadcast Information Office can contact the BLO on behalf of the Rights Holder.

"A small team of BLOs has been operating in Doha for most of November," continues Nathalie, "helping to prepare the early periods of competition and to set up the BIOs. With the team now fully here, we are more then ready to assist Rights Holders in the smooth running of their operations."
